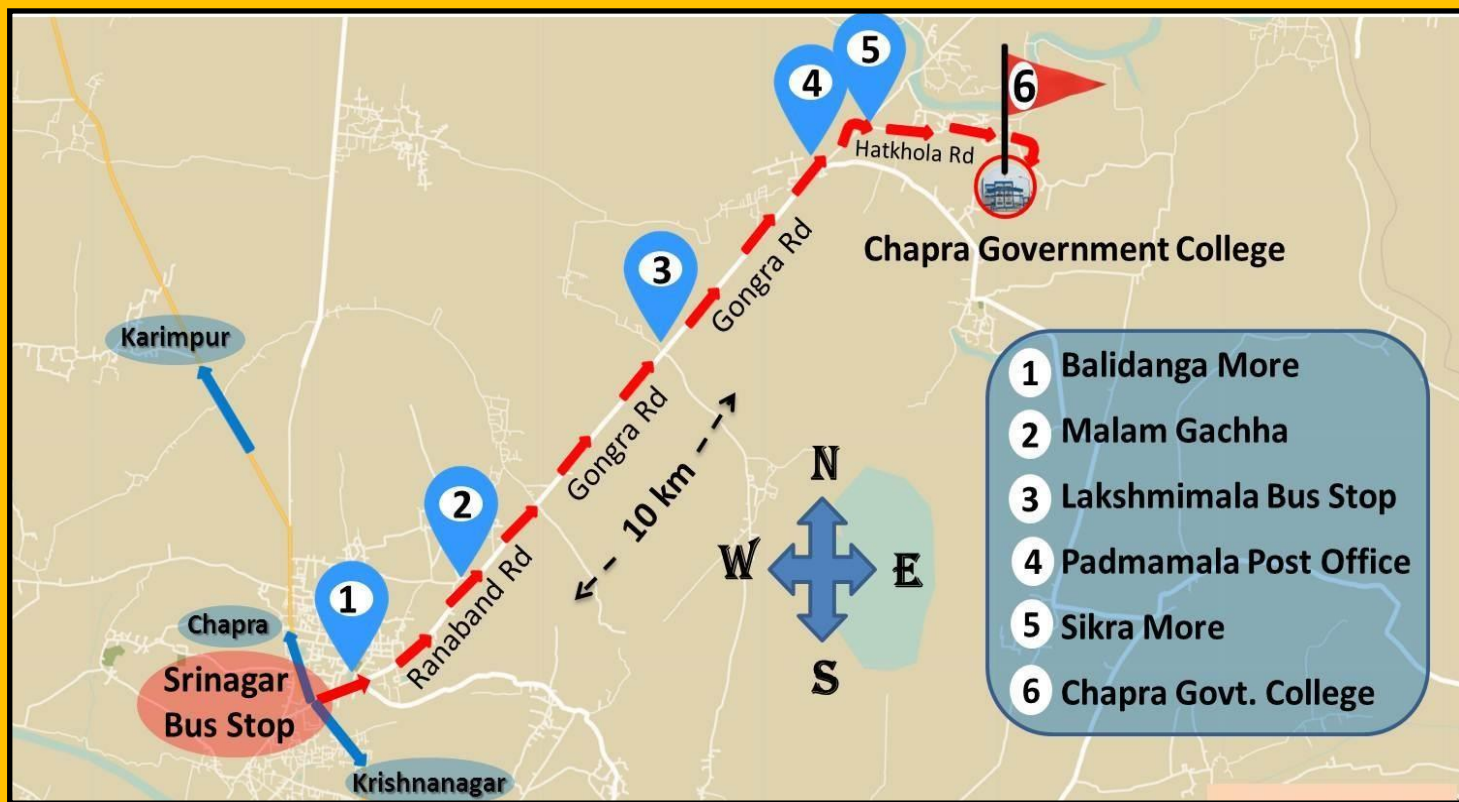

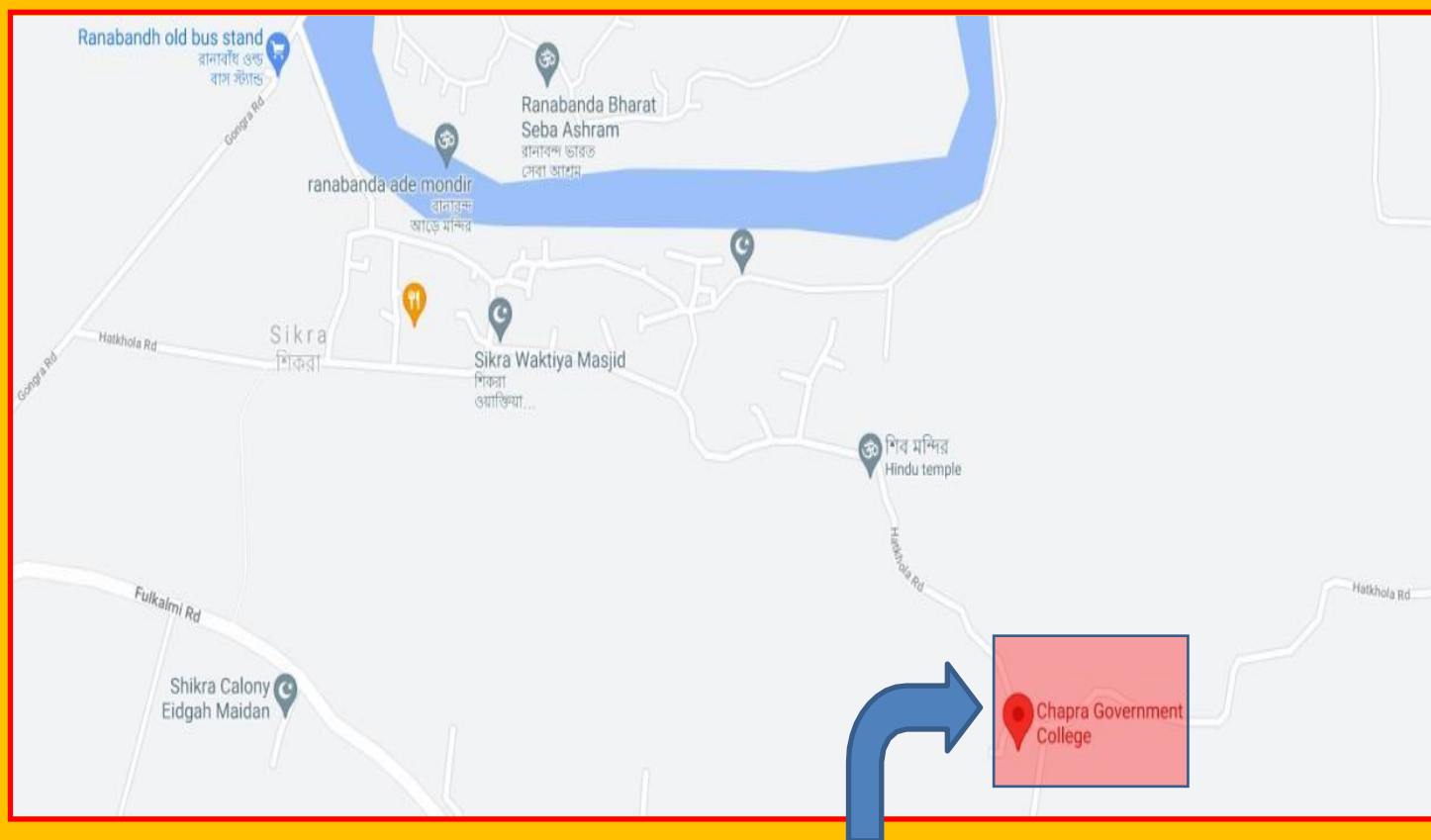

PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Government General Degree College, Chapra is established in the year 2013 in the outskirts of the village Shikra, JL No- 23, P.S. Chapra, Dist. Nadia. The college is established by the approval of the Cabinet vide Memo No. Edn(A)/10M-9/13, dated 30.10.2013 with the concurrence of the order in the Department of Finance, Government of West Bengal. It is a rural Undergraduate General Degree College affiliated to the University of Kalyani. It is one of the four newly established public colleges in the district of Nadia. With a total area of 4.82 acres of land, the lush green verdure of the sprawling campus soothes the eyes. The college is surrounded by enriched cultivated crop fields. Primarily catering to the interests of the rural poor community in the neighboring areas, the college has since its inception worked ceaselessly towards the spread of education among the poor students and rural communities inhabiting the areas. Every year it has been seen that there is a steady increase in the number of student enrolment in various academic departments. The college offers undergraduate programs in both Humanities and Science subjects. Honours and programme courses are offered for five Humanities Departments viz., English, Bengali, History, Political Science and Sociology, and B.Sc. Programme Course in Science (Chemistry, Mathematics and Physics). The dedicated faculty members of the institution provide their complete co-operation in fostering a strong academic integrity and encourage the students to follow the path of excellence.

Facilities and Infrastructure

The college has a three-storeyed building and promotes an eco-friendly campus. Along with the usual classrooms, it provides excellent state of the art infrastructure with laboratories, library, computer rooms, administrative block, teachers' rooms, separate common rooms for boys and girls, one audio-visual room, seminar rooms, and multipurpose hall for undertaking large scale programs. To enhance games and sports activities, the institute has built volleyball and basketball courts and has a playground as well. There is a small enclosed area inside the college with sitting arrangements where students can sit, talk and take respite in between the class hours as well.

Teaching and Learning

As per the directives of UGC and the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal, the teachers of the college are regularly engaged in taking classes through offline mode. The institution has taken special care towards the poor and underprivileged students of the area by taking classes through video conference call as well. In future the institution intends to help students more and tries to look after their interests always.

In the context of sports and games, the college can boast of its large playground with provision of both indoor and outdoor game facilities. The playgrounds are regularly used by the students for enhancing their ability of performances in different outdoor games. From earning sports scholarships to pursuing a professional sports career, there are lots of benefits for being an athlete in college level. Our college has taken keen interest in identifying and promoting students talented in sports activities. The Annual Sports competition is held at the beginning of every year. SCIENCE LABORATORIES: -

Physics Laboratory-

The Department of Physics of GGDC, Chapra offers 'state of the art' laboratories so that students can have a hands-on experience of all the modern experiments in Physics. The Department has three main laboratories:

1. **General Lab** (Ground Floor)
2. **Optical Lab and dark Lab** (1st floor) and
3. **Electrical and Electronics Lab** (1st floor).

All the labs are well-equipped and full of latest instruments related to electricity, sound, light and many more which enable the students to get a concept of basic Physics. Set-up of few experiments has always been kept ready to demonstrate the basic Physics, and for the rest of the set-up, particularly in case of optical experiments, students are being engaged to get a hands-on experience during the experiments. Teachers are always ready to discuss with the

students and try to address their problems and doubts which generally arise during the experiments. Most of the theory classes have been taken at Physics laboratories so that the teachers can share their knowledge of theory along with the experimental concept. Besides the Physics laboratories, the Department of Physics also offers computer facilities to our students to enhance their knowledge in the area of computer machine languages e.g. FORTRAN, C, C++, Python etc.

Chemistry Laboratory

The Department of Chemistry and its laboratory has started functioning since the year 2016. Since then, our laboratory is being improved day by day very rapidly. We know that practical work in a laboratory is essential for students to explore the deep understanding of fundamental science like Chemistry. Being a government college, we are fortunate enough to have three well-equipped laboratories for the organic, inorganic and physical chemistry. We have a conductometer,

pH meter, refractometer, four digit accurate balance, magnetic stirrer and many other instrumental facilities in our laboratory. In addition to this, all types of valuable chemicals, glassware, excellent pipeline of water and gas facilities are also available in the laboratory premises. Therefore, science students after 10+2, are heartily welcome to our college and they can play with colours of chemistry in order to develop their intellect and establish themselves for the future.



Our Chemistry faculty members A.B. sir (Left) is delivering lectures to the students in a friendly atmosphere in which students can ask any type of queries during and even after the classes. Even students are encouraged to prepare and participate for all types of competitive examinations as well as science quiz programs.



LIBRARY:-

The College has a central library facility for the students. The library is large, well-stocked with a collection of about thousand books on different disciplines. The Students are allowed to borrow books for a specific time period. The students can make the best use of the quiet Reading Hall by gleaning valuable bits of insight and information from the handy reference books and study materials. The library is being enriched every year with new publications which are necessary for the students for preparing their study materials. The reading room facilities are also available for the students and teachers. There is no Librarian, but one skilled Data Entry Operator, Koushik Halder (degree & knowledge in Library Science) is monitoring entire Central Library works under the In-Charge, Sri Rudra Sekhar Basu, Assistant Prof. in Political Science.

ADMISSION PROCESS

ADMISSION PROCESS TO THREE YEAR UNDER-GRADUATE COURSES

Government General Degree College, Chapra welcomes students for the admission in three year B.A (Honours), B.A (Programme) and B.Sc (Programme) courses under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) of the University of Kalyani. (All the information regarding current admission is available in the college website. Please logon to www.chapragovtcollege.org)

Eligibility for Admission 2019-2020:-

- i) Aggregate shall imply best of 5 subjects excluding ENVS (as per Guidelines issued by Kalyani University)
 - ii) Students of vocational stream can only apply for B.A./B.Sc. General Course.
 - iii) Candidates shall be allowed for admission within 03 (three) consecutive academic sessions including the year of passing the previous qualifying examination. (For example: candidates passing H.S. Examination in the year 2017 will get last chance of admission in the academic session 2019-2020)
 - iv) To calculate aggregate or merit score, full marks of each subject shall be scaled down to 100, wherever necessary.
 - v) For any matters not covered by the present set of guidelines, decision of the University shall be applicable.
 - vi) Those applying for admission under Sports Quota, shall still need to fulfil the minimum eligibility criteria of respective subject as well as the eligibility criteria from respective sporting discipline.
 - vii) For students coming from other boards, best five subjects must include English.
- Candidates who have passed Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent examination in 2019 (or 2018) from any recognized Board are eligible to apply admission to First Year.
 - As per the decision of the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal, there is no need to pay for filling up the college admission form.
 - Students can apply only through the online portal as per the First Year Admission notice of the college.
 - Students will have the opportunity to be admitted to the college on the basis of merit.
 - To apply for admission in the first year, they must comply with the rules laid down by the University of Kalyani and College authorities.
 - According to the reservation policy of the Government of West Bengal, SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B and Physically Challenged candidates are eligible for reservation benefits.
 - Anti-ragging declaration as per UGC norm is mandatory at the time of admission
 - During the time of admission two attested copies (Attestation to be done by Head of the Institution last Attended) of the following documents have to be submitted–
 - 1. Class X Admit Card
 - 2. Class XII Mark Sheet
 - 3. First page of Bank Pass Book
 - 4. SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B (If applicable)

5. Original Character Certificate from school as attended)
6. 2copy of recent passport size photograph (Not Attested)
7. 1copyofAadharCard.
8. All the original documents have to be shown during the time of verification of the admission process.

• INSTITUTIONAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Attendance

According to the rules of the University of Kalyani, Students failing the requirement of minimum attendance may not be allowed to appear as a regular student in University Examinations. This rule is strictly applicable for UG students.

Percentage of Attendance

- A student attending at least 75% of the total number of classes* held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations subject to fulfilment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
 - A student attending at least 60% but less than 75% of the total number of classes* held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations subject to the payment of prescribed condonation fees and fulfilment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
 - A student attending less than 60% of the total number of classes* held shall not be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations and he /she has to pursue admission to the same Semester in the very next year for attending the classes and appearing at the said Semester Examination.
- *Such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or the date of admission, whichever is later.

General Rules

Students must go through the College Notice Board regularly for information. Students must bring his/her Identity Card issued by the Principal. Polite and respectful behaviour towards the teachers, the non-teaching staff of the college and the fellow students are expected from a student. Students are required to maintain cleanliness. All the students of the college are expected to participate in the college activities like sports and Cultural functions. Authority is not responsible for any loss of personal property.

Guardians are requested to attend Parent-Teacher meetings as arranged by the College.

Statutory Warning

- Irregular attendance, habitual late coming or objectionable behaviours of any kind may result in the removal of a student from this college.
- Unfair means and /or possession of unauthorized materials in any examination will result in annulment of a student's entire term of results. A student who rendered unfair assistance to another will equally share the punishment.
- Students are not allowed to use Cell phones & other electronic gadgets during a Class Lecture & Practical session.
- Smoking, use of drugs, alcohol and peddling drugs in the campus are strictly prohibited.
- Any ill treatment both physical and verbal based on gender, caste and religion will lead to dismissal.
